

Study program:

US MBA degree. All courses are taught in English

Exchange periods:

The duration of the MBA is 11 months, comprised of three trimesters, starting in Sept and finishing in the summer. In the fall semesters mostly core courses are offered; whereas in the winter/spring and summer semesters many electives are taught. Although exchange students are welcome for any of the three trimesters, it is better to come during the spring or summer term. Additional electives can be taken with the weekend MBA groups, their program is two years; so elective courses are always offered. There are also opportunities to take courses at the School's various Msc programs as well.

Opportunity to earn a US MBA at a large tuition discount

Exchange students have the option of earning CEU's US MBA by applying, at the time of their nomination, for admission into the full-time program. (Application form available [here](#).) In that case, they should start their exchange in the fall. No tuition is charged while on the exchange; afterwards, exchange students qualify for a 50% tuition discount (from CEU's already low tuition) for their second and third trimesters; a real deal!

Faculty Profiles:	Professor Profiles
Language requirement:	Students coming from non-English degree programs are required to submit proof of English language skills, that is, an acceptable TOEFL/IELTS or similar score. Coming from an English-language program is sufficient proof of English language proficiency.
Language Courses:	Hungarian and other foreign language courses are available at CEU's main campus. Exchange students may register for such courses.
Instructional Format:	Just like in any mainstream US MBA program, combining lectures, case studies, individual and group projects, term papers, business games, presentations, classroom discussions, and exams.
Course Load:	Whatever is acceptable to the home (sending) institution; we expect a minimum of 12 credits per trimester.
Grading and Transcripts:	The School employs a 4.00 point grading scale (letter grading: A, A-, B+, B, B-, C+, and F). Transcripts will be supplied to the home institution at the end of the exchange period.
Tablet or laptop:	All MBAs should have a portable computer they can use in class.
<u>Academic Calendar:</u>	
<u>Trimester I.</u>	September 2, 2016 – December 18, 2016
<u>Trimester II.</u>	January 3, 2017 – April 2, 2017
<u>Trimester III.</u>	April 3, 2017 – August 31, 2017
<u>Special summer program</u>	June-July: dates of individual courses vary, ranging from intensive single weekends to 1-week to up to six-weeks. (Schedules available from nagy@business.ceu.edu)
Living Expenses:	Students should budget about HUF 250,000 (approximately 800 Euro) per month for accommodation, utilities, meals, city transportation, instructional materials, and personal expenses. https://www.ceu.edu/studentlife/onlineorientation/costofliving
CEU Residence Center:	Visiting and non-degree students may stay - under special institutional agreements - until they find an apartment to rent. 3,000 HUF/day for stays over 31 days (= Euro 10/day) 5,500 HUF/day for stays between 1-30 days (= Euro 18/day).
Rented Accommodation:	Individual or shared apartments range between HUF 100,000 - 200,000 per month (Euro 300 - 600).
Health insurance:	All students must have insurance covering the duration of their program. An appropriate health insurance policy can be purchased from CEU.
Visa:	Not required for citizens of member countries of the European Union. Citizens of all other countries must obtain long-term visa for study purposed from the local Hungarian embassy or consulate. More information: https://www.ceu.edu/studentlife/services/onlineorientation/visaarrivals
Facilities:	Upon arrival, each incoming exchange student receives a student ID card. With it, he/she can use all the facilities at the Business School, Residence Center, Library, Medical Center, Computer & IT services, and athletic facilities, including a gym.
Career services:	Exchange students are eligible to use the services offered by the School's Career Office.
Scholarships:	Scholarships (living expense support) through the Erasmus Mundus Program may be available to exchange students through their home institution if it has an Erasmus agreement with CEU Business School.
