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Arrival and Orientation

<p>October Starters</p>	<p>Students are asked to arrive on either Saturday 30th September 2017 or Sunday 1st October 2017 depending on which college they are assigned to.</p> <p>Events will take place throughout the week including Orientation for Study Abroad/Exchange and Erasmus+ students and Course Enrolment. Students will receive a pre-arrival guide electronically before arrival and a hard copy of the orientation guide when they arrive.</p> <p>Teaching will start on Monday 9th October 2017.</p>
<p>January Starters</p>	<p>Students are asked to arrive on Tuesday 9th January 2018.</p> <p>Events will take place throughout the week including Orientation for Study Abroad/Exchange and Erasmus+ students and Course Enrolment. Students will receive a pre-arrival guide electronically before arrival and a hard copy of the orientation guide when they arrive.</p> <p>Teaching will start on Monday 15th January 2018.</p>



Accommodation

Exchange and Study Abroad students are guaranteed a room on campus provided they apply by the deadline.

Applications are made online from June (for October starters) and late November (for January starters). Emails are sent to students at the start of application period with further information about how to apply.

Unfortunately, it is not possible to guarantee accommodation on campus for Erasmus+ students, though they are encouraged to apply.

Summer Programmes

<p>Introducing Britain</p>	<p>This summer programme gives an overview of British culture, history and politics over the past three hundred years, focussing on crucial historical events and their impact on Britain. It can be taken as a stand-alone programme or prior to study at Lancaster or another British university.</p> <p>Introducing Britain is equivalent to a first-year undergraduate Lancaster University course. Students who complete this course are awarded 3 US / 6 ECTS credits or 4 US / 8 ECTS credits. 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<p>Understanding Britain (Formerly known as International Summer Programme)</p>	<p>The programme provides an opportunity to experience life at a British university while learning about the history and culture of the UK, and specifically the North-West of England. As well as experiencing lectures by renowned academics, students will be able to discuss the course topics in small seminar groups and go on field trips to relevant sites in the North-West of England each week.</p> <p>It can be taken as a stand-alone programme or prior to study at Lancaster or another British university.</p> <p>Understanding Britain is a more advanced module equivalent to a second-year course.
